Chinese Fan Palm thrives in bright, indirect light. It can tolerate some low light, but its growth may slow, and the leaves could lose vibrancy. Avoid placing it in direct sunlight, as it can scorch the delicate fronds.



SOIL

For palm trees mix 2/3 Rooted Goods All-Purpose Potting Mix or Uncle Mike's Organic Potting Mix and 1/3 coarse gardening sand. Alternatively, you can use Espoma's Organic Cactus mix.



Chinese Fan Palm prefers consistent watering to keep the soil slightly moist but not soggy. Water it when the top 1-2 inches of soil feel dry to the touch. Be sure to water thoroughly, allowing excess water to drain out, and always empty the saucer to prevent root rot.



We recommend fertilizers like Espoma Organic Palm Tone, Jack's Houseplant Special, or Organic Plant Magic. These options provide essential nutrients to keep your plants vibrant and thriving.

PRUNING & PROPAGATION

Soak seeds in warm water for 24-48 hours, then plant them ½ inch deep in well-draining soil. Keep the soil moist and place the pot in a warm spot between 75-85°F (24-29°C). Use a plastic cover to maintain humidity. Germination can take weeks to months. Once seedlings grow a few inches tall, transplant them into larger pots.

• TEMPERATURE

Chinese Fan Palm thrives in temperatures between 60-80°F (16-27°C). It prefers warm, stable environments and should be kept away from cold drafts, air conditioners, or heaters. Avoid exposing it to temperatures below 50°F (10°C), as this can stress the plant and damage its leaves.
