# **MAJESTY PALM**

## **Ö** Light

Majesty Palm thrives in bright, indirect light. Place it near a window that gets plenty of filtered sunlight, such as an eastor south-facing window. While it can tolerate partial shade, insufficient light may lead to slower growth and less vibrant fronds. Avoid direct sunlight indoors, as it can scorch the delicate leaves.



We recommend fertilizers like Espoma Organic Palm Tone, Jack's Houseplant Special, or Organic Plant Magic. These options provide essential nutrients to keep your plants vibrant and thriving.



Propagating Majesty Palms can be a bit tricky, as they don't produce offshoots or baby plants. For patient gardeners, the most common method of propagation is through seeds, though it's a slow-growing process. This method requires time and attention, as seeds can take several months to germinate.



### SOIL

For palm trees, mix 2/3 Rooted Goods All-Purpose Potting Mix or Uncle Mike's Organic Potting Mix and 1/3 coarse gardening sand. Alternatively, you can use Espoma's Organic Cactus mix. All three options are great choices for ensuring healthy growth and thriving plants.

### L TEMPERATURE

Majesty Palm thrives in temperatures between 65-85°F (18-29°C). It prefers a warm, stable environment and should be kept away from cold drafts, air conditioners, or heaters. Avoid exposing it to temperatures below 50°F (10°C), as this can stress the plant and damage its fronds.

# **W**ATER

Majesty Palm prefers soil that is kept evenly moist, but not soggy. Water when the top 1-2 inches of soil feel dry to the touch. Ensure the pot has proper drainage and always empty the saucer to prevent root rot. During winter, reduce watering slightly, as growth slows, but never allow the soil to dry out completely.



Monitor for common pests like spider mites and scale, Regularly inspect your plant for signs of infestation and treat promptly with natural or chemical remedies.

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
